

## **This is an outline of the Funding Opportunities for Erasmus+ for 2022**

### **The most relevant are KA131 and KA171**

#### **Erasmus+ (KA 131): Mobility within Europe (Deadline 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2022)**

The 2021-2027 programme places a strong focus on social inclusion, the green and digital transitions, and promoting young people's participation in democratic life. Key action 131 mainly supports physical mobilities. However, it is also possible to carry out blended mobilities. The EU education programme aims to achieve a high degree of flexibility in order to offer participation to all students. The programme supports university staff to train or teach in an international environment. With the EU Erasmus+ programme the following mobilities are funded within Key Action 131:

- Study abroad for people in bachelor, master and PhD programmes(SMS)
- Internships abroad for bachelor and master students(SMP)
- Mobility of teaching staff for the purpose of teaching (STA)
- Staff Mobility for continuing education and training (STT)

#### **KA171 Student and Staff Mobility (Deadline 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2022)**

This action supports physical and blended mobility of higher education students and staff from/to third countries not associated to Erasmus+. Students in all study fields and cycles can take part in a study period or traineeship abroad. Higher education teaching and administrative staff can take part in professional development activities abroad, as well as staff from the field of work in order to teach and train students or staff at higher education institutions.

### **KA2 Capacity Building in Higher Education (Deadline 17<sup>th</sup> February 2022)**

Capacity-building projects in the field of higher education support the modernisation, accessibility and internationalisation of higher education in Partner Countries. These projects build on the success of the Alfa, Edu-link and Tempus programmes.

The projects aim to encourage cooperation between the EU and Partner Countries and support eligible Partner Countries in addressing challenges in the management and governance of their higher education institutions. This includes improving the quality of higher education, developing new and innovative education programmes, modernising higher education systems through reform policies as well as fostering cooperation across different regions of the world through joint initiatives. ### **Erasmus Mundus (Deadline 16<sup>th</sup> February 2022)**

Students at master's level from all over the world can apply. You must have a bachelor's degree (first degree) or be in your last year of bachelor studies and graduate before the master's programme starts. You may also apply if you demonstrate a bachelor's equivalent level of learning. This must be officially recognised, according to national legislation and practices, in the degree awarding country.

About Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters scholarships

Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters are high-level and integrated study programmes, at master level. They are designed and delivered by an international partnership of higher education institutions (HEI). They involve at least three HEI from three different countries, of which at least two must be EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme (previously called Programme Countries).
