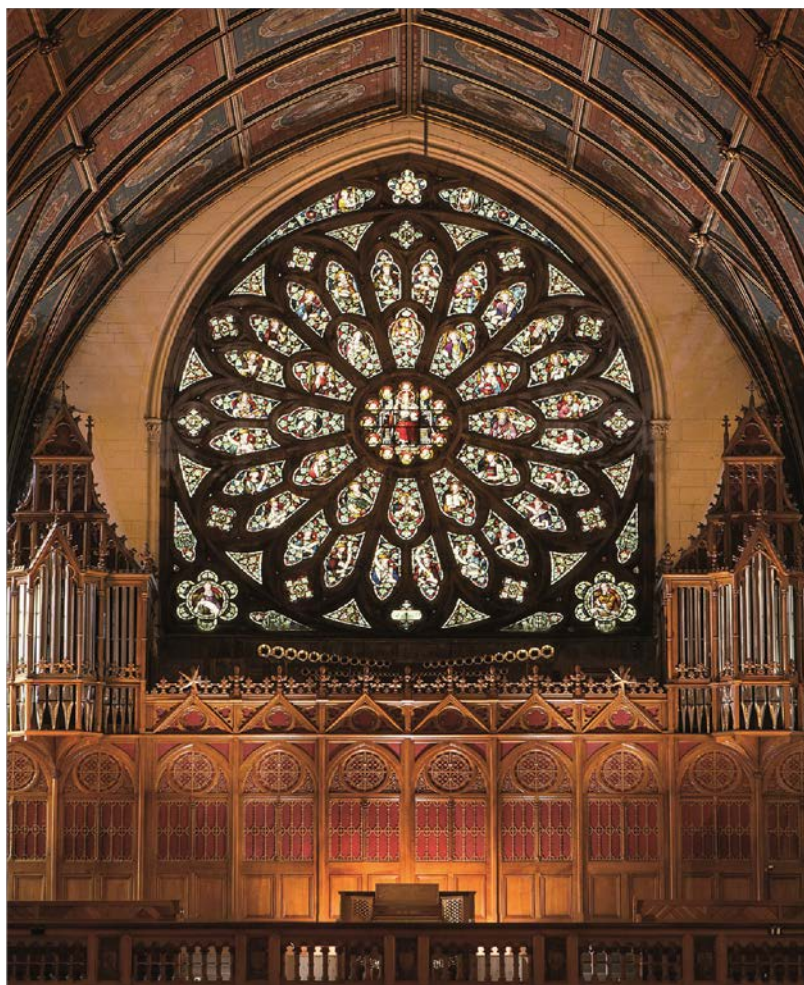

First Reading

A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

'Console my people, console them,' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and cry to her

A Reading from the Prophet Jeremiah 33:7-9, 14-16

I will restore the fortunes of Judah and Jerusalem, and build them again as they were before. I will cleanse them from every sin they have committed against me; the sins by which they offended me and apostatised from me, all these I will forgive. Gospel Reading

From the Holy Gospel According to John (1:1-18)

The Word Became Flesh

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things came into being, and not one thing came into being but through him. All that came to be had life in him and that life was the light of all people. A

that light shines in the darkness, a light the darkness could not overpower. A man came, sent from God. His name was John. He came as a witness, a witness to speak to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but only a witness to speak for the light. The Word was the true light that enlightens all; and he was coming into the world. He was in the world that had its being through him and the world did not know him. He came to his own domain, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to all who believed in the name of him who was born not out of human stock or urge of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a Father's only Son, full of grace and truth.
